A WORD FROM THE MAYOR

For many, the arrival of December marks a reflection on the year ending. It is with that in mind that I am giving you an overview of the main events from the first year of this Council.

Although not everything we wanted to achieve has fully materialized, great strides have been made and important items can now be added to the next municipal agenda.

Urban planning and regulations

Upon taking up its duties in November 2021, the Council focused on the revision of the urban plan and regulations, a major undertaking that spanned several years of work and consultations. The suggestions and constructive comments made by citizens and groups interested in the matter have led to the early 2022 adoption of a version that respects the will of all.

Among the changes made under this revision, the secondary housing units and the larger area granted to additional dwellings set examples in our MRC and elsewhere as well. These two important add-ons – combined with the decision to set aside 30% of the future eco-district for perpetually accessible property – truly open up access to housing at an affordable cost.

Wastewater Treatment Plant

The upgrade of the Treatment Plant is also one of the major projects pursued in 2022. We are awaiting confirmation on the subsidy percentage that will be granted. We will then be able to carry on this construction, still planned for 2023 and that includes:

- a basin with aerated ponds, replacing the filtering marshes;
- the addition of a phosphorus removal system;
- natural disinfection (not possible with the current system);
- a connection to the aqueduct network.

Creation of Advisory Committees

In line with what we announced before the elections, the Council set up four committees, each made up of a Councillor, a municipal representative and four citizens. The general mandate of these committees is defined by the Council:

Agriculture and Forestry — Foster the development of sustainable agriculture and forestry throughout our Municipality.

Culture and Tourism — Spotlight Frelighsburg's distinctive cultural and tourism attractions.

Environment — Work towards becoming a greener municipality.

Society — Working for the well-being and quality of life of all citizens, regardless of their age, interests and concerns.

As you will read later, tangible results are already emerging, while many other projects are in gestation and about to become a reality very soon.

A huge thank you to all committee members who spend so much energy doing things the right way.

Adherence to the Declaration of Commitment: United for the Climate

Adopted this summer, this declaration highlights the leading role of municipalities in dealing with climate change.

For every action we take, we will ask ourselves if our choice is the right choice and if our decision is the most coherent with that commitment.

Governments, civil society and citizens alike are all part of the problem, but also the solution.

I am very proud of our unanimous commitment to let our coping with climate change permanently drive our Council decisions.

Slow Down!

To protect our gravel roads, increase pedestrian safety and lessen dust-related problems, the Municipal Council recently adopted a by-law reducing the speed to 50 km/h and prohibiting trucks – except for local deliveries – on all municipal roads.

These measures receive the approval of a large number of citizens and reflect the current trend of responsible motoring. We stand by our decision

and hope that we will eventually have the entire community on side.

Fire Brigade

The call for tenders for the purchase of a pumper fire truck is ready to be initiated. This truck will be equipped with a large capacity tank and pump and will replace two existing trucks that are reaching the end of their life. If you are interested, a few part-time firefighter positions are open.

Communication

Various actions have been taken to maintain open communication with the community.

- In addition to the "Actualités" featured on frelighsburg.ca, the Municipality now has a Facebook page to quickly inform the population during urgent or specific situations, and to announce events that are held here or in the MRC.
- ${\boldsymbol{\cdot}}$ The Messenger has resumed its monthly publication, which was interrupted during the pandemic.
- For greater accessibility and to encourage participation, the Council continues to hold its meetings in hybrid mode. In addition, recordings of the meetings are available on the Municipality's website.
- The provisional agenda for each meeting is available on frelighsburg.ca before the weekend preceding the meeting.
- A calendar of all the activities in which the Municipality is involved is available online.

We carried out many other initiatives during the year, including:

- Hiring of a full-time Administrative Assistant and a full-time Director of Public Works, and a part-time Town Planner and part-time Inspector;
- \bullet Major work on Pinnacle, Spencer and Selby Roads;
- Transition to a paperless administration;
- Development of Goodhue Park, including widening the access road, building a sidewalk, expanding the parking lot, and obtaining a \$63,307.45 grant for the pump track;
- Town Hall now opens 5 days a week (by appointment on Fridays);
- Agreement with the Garagona Association regarding the Summer Day Camp;
- The Municipality having a Forest Producer status;
- and much more!

I take much pleasure in working with such a great Council and General Manager. Everyone is fully committed and puts their heart into every project. Even when differences arise – and they do, believe me! – exchanges of ideas and dialogues are always constructive and respectful. Thank you to my colleagues and the Municipal Team for the hard work throughout the year.

In closing, the Holiday Season is certainly a time when we need to pull together, share and support each other. There could therefore be no better time to announce the creation of the Benevolent Squad, a wonderful initiative of the Society Advisory Committee.

Whether for support or to carry out difficult tasks, the volunteers of the Squad are there for you. If they cannot help you, rest assured they will do their very best to direct you to the support you need.
