A WORD FROM THE MAYOR

Hello everyone,

October is already upon us, with its delicious apples and grapes, and its great colours. What a wonderful season!

Here is what grabs our attention this month:

Extension of the Aqueduct

Weather permitting, work to connect the municipal aqueduct to the Water Treatment Plant and the future Fire Station will begin on Monday, October 2, and end during the same week.

The impact of this work will be felt mainly on Rue Principale, at the intersection of Road 237 South and Chemin Saint-Armand. One traffic lane will remain open at all times.

Boil Water Advisory

Connection to current infrastructure will require a service

interruption. To lower its impact, the interruption is planned for late evening, and only a few houses will be affected.

However, such disruption automatically generates a boil water advisory for all users of the aqueduct, even in homes unaffected by the service interruption. A boil water advisory notice with instructions will be distributed to each door at the appropriate time.

New Obligations under Law 25

The *Loi modernisant des dispositions législatives en matière de protection des renseignements personnels* has gradually come into force since 2022.

Since September 22, 2023, Bill 25 has introduced a series of new obligations for municipalities, including adopting measures to protect personal information in light of the development of new technologies. Implementation of these obligations will result in processing delays for all access to information requests.

Festi'Bois 2023

The 2023 edition of Festi'Bois – an emblematic event for Frelighsburg – is held on the last weekend of September.

The Municipality will have a booth on the site outside the Anglican church. This will be an opportunity to showcase the forestry development approach of the Municipal Park and to highlight the importance of the forest, a driving force for our economy, our culture and socially responsible environmentalism.

NEWS FROM THE ADVISORY COMMITTEES

Environment

The Committee was present at the Farmers Market on September 9. This presence allowed you to test your knowledge of recyclable materials and to discuss achievements to date. Thanks to the Farmers Market for the warm welcome!

Since its creation, the Environment Committee has raised awareness and informed the community, participated in decision-making and collaborated with the other Advisory Committees of the Municipality as well as with other municipalities in the Brome-Missisquoi area.

So far, the Committee has prepared four conferences on water, light pollution and invasive alien species. In collaboration with the Municipality's Urban Planning Department, committee members also took part in the drafting of regulations on rain barrels and the use of drinking water. Suggestions were also made to the Municipal Council as part of the mandate for the study Municipality's aqueduct network throughput.

Finally, the Environment Committee actively aims at carrying out other projects over the next year, including:

- \Rightarrow Create a rain garden on one of the Municipality's lands.
- \Rightarrow Adopt policies to promote eco-friendly consumption.
- ⇒ Make a pamphlet that shows good environmental practices when purchasing a property;
- ⇒ Provide regulatory provisions to control herbicides in agricultural and inhabited areas;
- \Rightarrow Develop a strategy for preventing and controlling invasive alien plants.

Arts Centre

Until October 29, the exhibition presents the works of Catherine Arsenault who focuses on the Polytechnique event that occurred on December 6, 1989. She turns the exhibition hall into a remembrance place for the violence against these women.

This remembrance is carried by 14 photographs of bouquets, titled Cénotaph, on which the artist has sewn flowers picked in her garden, and by an installation. The screening of the Lacrimosa video where Catherine Arsenault recounts the stages of her creative process testifies to her intimate and historical reading of this event.

Adélard/Loto-Québec Exhibit

Saturday, October 7, at 5 p.m. will be the vernissage of Audrey Beaulé's exhibition titled "Il existe de ces feux intérieurs qui illuminent des continents" at the Bishop Stewart Memorial Church.

Program: meeting with the artist, poetry reading, bar and musical ambience. The exhibit, which will run until November 26, commemorates the 75th anniversary of the Refus global by exploring the historical reverberance of an emancipation aesthetic. Audrey Beaulé presents a set of previously unpublished artworks together with a selection of works by signatories of the famous manifesto from the prestigious Collection Loto-Québec, including artworks by Jean-Paul Riopelle, Françoise Sullivan and Marcelle Ferron. The exhibition is open Saturdays and Sundays from 12 p.m. to 5 p.m.

In October, Pascale Théorêt-Groulx continues her research residency at Studio Adélard (not open to the public). During his stay, the artist explores the rivers that flow into Missisquoi Bay and studies the impact of dams on water quality. Her project, promoted by the Lake Champlain Basin Program, will produce artwork that combines sitespecific outdoor installation and video art that will be shown in the fall of 2024.

Frelighsburg Historical and Heritage Society

October 7 to November 26, every Saturday and Sunday from 12 p.m. to 5 p.m., two guides from the Society will welcome visitors to the Bishop Stewart Anglican Church in Frelighsburg for the historical interpretation of this heritage-rich building.

The guides will also direct visitors to the Loto-Québec exhibition, provided by Adélard. This activity is made possible thanks to financial assistance from the Brome-Missisquoi Pact and the Municipality of Frelighsburg. A great activity not to be missed!
