### Dandelion-friendly May

Like many other municipalities and towns, Frelighsburg has taken the dandelion challenge for several years. In May, pollinating insects and bees face a scarcity of food. Among the first flowers to bloom after winter, dandelions provide them with abundant nectar. By letting the grass and dandelions grow until they turn white, we can help promote plant pollination, biodiversity, and the productivity of gardens. Let's all work together to protect the environment.

### Financial Statements and Auditor's Report

At the upcoming Council meeting, we will present the key points of the financial report and the external auditor's report for the financial year that ended on December 31, 2023. We will mail you a copy of these reports shortly.

### Speed in the Village

After the recent accident on Rue Principale, where a truck crashed into a Hydro post near Paul-Goodhue Park, I received many comments calling for the speed to be reduced in the village and that the 50 km/h speed limit be posted sooner at the village entrances.

It's worth noting that Rue Principale, along with all roads leading to the village, falls under the jurisdiction of the Ministère des Transports. The Municipality doesn't have the authority to intervene directly on any issue, including traffic speed, changes to the reduced speed areas, installation of speed bumps, or other arrangements. Our contacts at the Ministère are the ones who assess the requests and decide whether to approve or reject them.

We regularly send requests to the Ministère for speed revisions to ensure that traffic speeds are appropriate for the reality of our village. We will continue to work towards this goal.

## NEWS FROM THE ADVISORY COMMITTEES

### ENVIRONMENT

Exciting developments within the Environment Advisory Committee!

Invasive Exotic Plants (IEP)

The Environment Advisory Committee and the Agricultural and Forestry Committee are collaborating with other organizations such as Mount Pinnacle Land Trust, comité Pré, Dura-Club, etc., to create an action plan to control two invasive exotic plants found in Frelighsburg.

The plants are Japanese knotweed (*Reynoutria japonica*), which is present along the Rivière aux Brochets and in ditches along the roads, and glossy or cathartic buckthorn (*Rhamnus frangula* and *cathartica*), which is reported in certain woodlands. We don't yet know the exact extent of their occurrence on our territory.

Mount Pinnacle Land Trust has received financial support from the Ministère de l'Environnement, de la Lutte contre les changements climatiques, de la Faune et des Parcs for invasive exotic plants. Together with the Trust, the Environment Committee is developing an action plan for 2024.

The goal for the summer of 2024 is to create a team of volunteers who will participate in the knotweed and buckthorn inventory in targeted locations. To achieve this, professionals will provide two training courses to equip volunteers with the knowledge to identify and report on the plants in a geo-locatable manner.

The first training course will be held before the trail cleaning chore on May 4, at the entrance to the Municipal Park at 9 am (approximately 30 minutes). The second training course will be organized in a 5 à 7 format, on June 6, at the Municipal Park.

Anyone interested is welcome to join! Your daily hikes could be very beneficial for our municipality.

### Rainwater Collection Barrels

Don't forget that the subsidy for the purchase of rainwater barrels is still in effect until the budget provided for this purpose is exhausted. Keep your proof of purchase and you can get up to 100 \$ per property for the purchase of your rainwater barrels.

### Tree Cutting

Please be reminded that cutting trees within the urban area is strictly prohibited without first obtaining a permit.

Cutting trees outside the urban area is only allowed if it is part of forest development and a permit has been obtained. Otherwise, cutting down any tree is **not permitted**. If you notice a tree that poses a danger, please inform the Urban Planning Department by sending a message to [urbanisme@frelighsburg.ca](mailto:urbanisme@frelighsburg.ca) or by calling 450 298-5133, ext. 122.

### Raccoon Rabies

There has been a recent increase in the number of cases of raccoon rabies recorded in Vermont. To address this, the Ministère de l'Environnement, de la Lutte contre les changements climatiques, de la Faune et des Parcs has carried out a vaccination operation in 17 municipalities, including Frelighsburg.

The operation aims to immunize raccoons, skunks, and foxes against raccoon rabies to help protect the health of the human population.

### Safe behaviour reminder

- If you have been bitten or scratched by an animal or have come into contact with its saliva, clean the wound with soap and water for 10 to 15 minutes, even if it appears minor. Quickly contact Info-Santé 811 to obtain appropriate medical follow-up.
- Do not approach unknown animals, wild or domestic, even if they seem harmless.
- Never touch the carcass of a wild animal with your bare hands.
- Take measures to prevent animals from being attracted to your property, such as storing outdoor trash cans out of reach of animals and not feeding your pets outside.
- Do not displace unwanted animals or animals that appear orphaned. Doing so could spread diseases to other territories.
- Consult a veterinarian to vaccinate your pet against rabies or if it has been in contact with a wild animal that could transmit rabies.
