#### **Spring Burning**

Many residents clean up their land or yard at springtime. Before lighting up, read the following: always keep in mind that the wind is your worst enemy. In a matter of seconds, a gust of wind can spread your fire, often over great distances. A single moment of carelessness can make you lose control of your fire and create a forest fire that could engulf your home, your cottage or that of a neighbour. You must obtain a burning permit (free) issued by the Municipality's Fire Department by calling (450) 298-5133, ext. 25.
